

MONITORING AND REPORTING COMMUNITY OUTCOMES

In 2004, following the identification of Rotorua’s Community Outcomes, a cross-sector working group identified 32 indicators to gauge progress. Each indicator was represented by between one and three ‘measures’, for example economic growth was measured by an economic growth index and business confidence index. Key stakeholders and members of the public subsequently had opportunities during the 2008 Community Outcomes Review to give feedback on the indicators set. This resulted in a range of additional indicators and measures being proposed. The full set (as at 2009/10) encompasses 39 indicators represented by 76 measures. Results for the full set of indicators and measures are presented in this Data Analysis Report Update.

This report forms part of a framework of regular monitoring and reporting to the wider community (refer diagram below). Additional data has been collected through a collaborative regional survey administered by Environment BOP, as well as a Rotorua Community Outcomes Survey commissioned by Rotorua District Council. The regional survey was an initiative of COBOP (Community Outcomes Bay of Plenty), an ongoing collaboration of local authorities and Central Government agencies focused on enhancing community well-being throughout the Bay of Plenty Region. Council also benefits from the Choosing Futures Waikato regional collaboration, including lessons learned in the Waikato Region in relation to monitoring and reporting progress toward Community Outcomes.
