

INTRODUCTION

This report presents one-page summaries of strategies being implemented by a wide variety of government agencies and non-government organisations that contribute to achieving community outcomes in the Rotorua District. As indicated in the Contents pages, each strategy can be related to one or more of Rotorua's Community Outcomes, which are currently defined as (in no particular order):

- A safe and caring community.
- A prosperous community.
- A healthy community.
- A community that respects its environment.
- A community that values its living Māori culture.
- A community with excellent facilities and services.
- A learning community.
- A community with strong leadership.

Wherever possible, the summaries in this document reflect text in the full strategy reports, modified to a standard format:

- Title.
- Author/key participants.
- Web address.
- Purpose.
- Objective(s).
- Key activities.

In many cases the terminology used in this document differs from that of the source document. For example "objectives" in this report may be described as a vision and/or mission in the source document and "key activities" in this report may be described as goals, objectives, action plans and/or groups of activities. In some cases the end date or review date of the strategy has been imputed from the source document's main text. Web addresses are provided where available.

In relation to regional strategic documents, the Rotorua District is mainly affiliated with Bay of Plenty-based regional agencies. In some cases the District is affiliated with Waikato-based regional agencies. In relation to environmental management, the southern part of the District is within Environment Waikato's jurisdiction.

Note: This report is primarily an overview of strategic plans for selected national, regional and local organisations. It covers only organisations for which strategic plans are readily accessible, particularly via the Internet. A small selection of ongoing strategic collaborations are also summarised, namely the Rotorua Partners Programme, COBoP (Community Outcomes Bay of Plenty), and the Choosing Futures Waikato regional partnership. This report does not include summaries of surveys results, research, monitoring, community profiling, health needs assessments, community consultation, legislation, policies, guidelines, targets or any other information that may have been used as a basis for strategic planning.
